### **GOOD NEWS: “THE JOY OF LOVE.”**

Last week, the result of the two Synods concerning Family Life was presented to the Church by Pope Francis in his Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation “Amoris Laetitia. The Exhortation begins with the phrase: “The joy of Love”.

The Exhortation is addressed to ‘Bishops, Priests and Deacons, consecrated Persons, Christian Married Couples and all the Ly Faithful, on love in the family.’ In other words to all of us.

I do not expect many people to read the exhortation in full, since much of it is addressed to those who will implement the suggestions contained within the document. The fact that it also a lengthy document will deter many from attempting it.

The following is taken from the introduction:

*The Synod process allowed for an examination of the situation of families in today’s world, and thus for a broader vision and a re-newed awareness of the importance of marriage and the family. The complexity of the issues that arose revealed the need for continued open discussion of a number of doctrinal, moral, spiritual, and pastoral questions. The thinking of pastors and theologians, if faithful to the Church, honest, realistic and creative, will help us to achieve greater clarity. The debates carried on in the media, in certain publications and even among the Church’s ministers, range from an immoderate desire for total change without sufficient reflection or grounding, to an attitude that would solve everything by applying general rules or deriving undue conclusions from particular theological considerations. #2.*

With the start of the Sacramental Preparation Programme for 2016 and the talk this week for Parents asking for Confirmation for their children, many would be saying, their parents were not involved in the preparation process. In their time for preparation, if there was preparation, the school was the main element. Now the parents are expected to be part of the preparation. This is reflected in the following passage from the Exhortation:

*The Bible also presents the family as the place where children are brought up in the faith. This is evident from the description of the Pass-over celebration (cf. Ex 12:26-27; Deut 6:20-25) and it later appears explicitly in the Jewish haggadah, the dialogue accompanying the rite of the Passover meal. One of the Psalms celebrates the proclamation of faith within families: “All that we have heard and known, that our fathers have told us, we will not hide from their children, but tell to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the Lord, and his might, and the wonders which he has wrought. He established a testimony in Jacob, and appointed a law in Israel, which he commanded our fathers to teach to their children; that the next generation might know them, the children yet unborn, and arise and tell them to their children” (Ps 78:3-6). The family is thus the place where parents become their children’s first teachers in the faith. They learn this “trade”, passing it down from one person to another: “When in time to come your son asks you... You shall say to him...” (Ex 13:14). Thus succeeding generations can raise their song to the Lord: “young men and maidens together, old and young together!” (Ps 148:12). #16.*

*Parents have a serious responsibility for this work of education, as the Biblical sages often remind us (cf. Prov 3:11-12; 6:20-22; 13:1; 22:15; 23:13-14; 29:17). Children, for their part, are called to accept and practice the commandment: “Honour your father and your mother” (Ex 20:12). Here the verb “to honour” has to do with the fulfilment of family and social commitments; these are not to be disregarded under the pretence of religious motives (cf. Mk 7:11-13). “Whoever honours his father atones for sins, and whoever glorifies his mother is like one who lays up treasure” (Sir 3:3-4). #17.*

Please pray for the families who are engaged in the sacramental Preparation Programme this year. They are making quite lengthy commitment for some and they will only be able to continue with the help and encouragement of the other members of the parish.

**Sacramental Preparation** We have begun the Sacramental Preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation. The parents of the candidates will meet today after the 9.00am Mass, then next week the candidates and parents will have their own sessions. Please keep them in your prayers.

### **Ministers of the Word and Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist**

For a Minister assisting with communion, what is required is someone who is steady on their feet, able to negotiate the steps up to the altar and someone with a devotion to the Blessed Sacrament.

In both cases, training will be made available. A yearly afternoon of reflection is a must for all ministers. Because you are working within the Eucharist, we would require you to complete a set of forms and you should obtain a Blue Card, the parish office can help you with these. 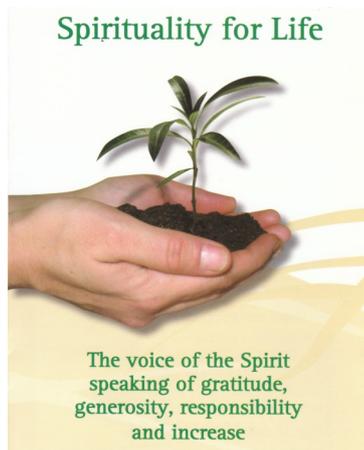
