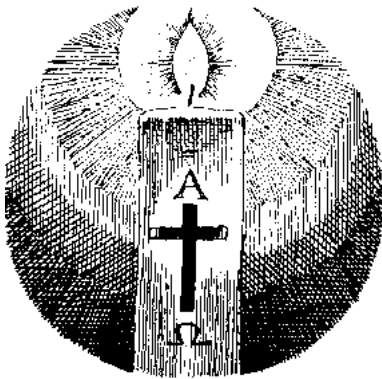

Good News: Resurrection and love.

On Easter Sunday, Jesus offers us the gift of presence and the gift of peace.

We are to know him in the breaking of bread, Jesus does not want to be insubstantial; he does not want to be a ghost. Instead he comes to us and invites us to touch him. He offers himself to us in ways that are intended to nourish and nurture us. He promise companionship.

So where are we touch him in today's world? Where are we to walk with him? Where are we to find his hands and feet? Where are we to offer a piece of broiled fish and eat and drink in his presence? Christianity is an embodied religion. It does not live between the pages of a book. Rather it invites us to engage with our world. So we are to recognize the presence of Jesus whenever there are wounded hands and feet that turn to us for healing and wherever there is a road that we can walk down in his company.

The gift lies in recognizing him even when he presents himself to us in hidden and unexpected ways. We need to believe that we can touch him in our everyday lives. We need to understand that we can walk with him. Our task is to seek out people who are needy and to turn our faces towards them rather than away from them. This is not difficult to do, for there are many wounded hands and feet that clamor for our attention. There are many hungry people who would love a bowl of fish, let alone a loaf of bread.

If Jesus is risen from the dead then we need proof, we need evidence. How can we secure this in today's world? The Gospel seems to suggest that the way forward is to open our hearts in love. No one is to be excluded, no situation is beyond the reach of grace. By believing this and putting into practice, we can become witnesses and carry the echo of his saving mission forwards into our world. Christian faith is not a personal possession. It is always for sharing. So everything comes full circle. We can be his witnesses. We can provide evidence that he is risen.

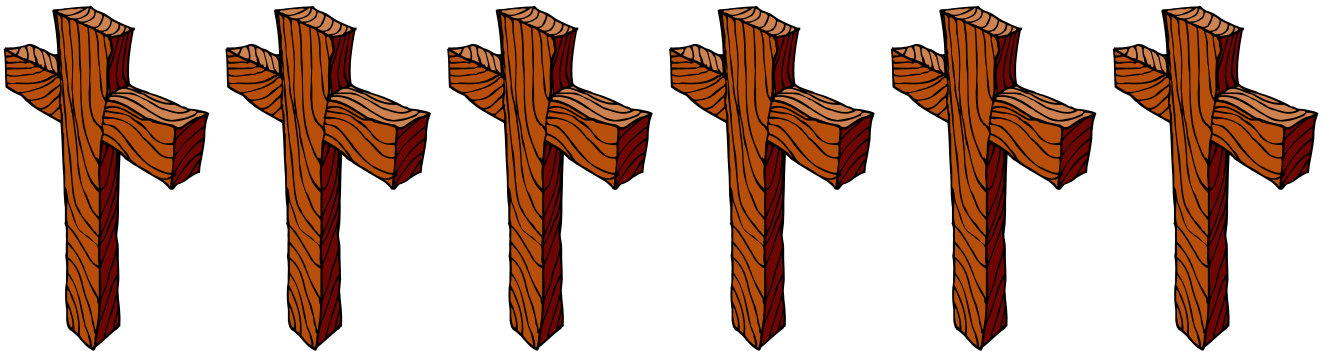
“Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth.” COLOSSIANS 3:2

Living As A Steward – Redemption and Stewardship

Jesus' disciples share in his priestly work, called to offer up the world and all that is in it – especially themselves – to the Lord of all. In exercising this office, they most fully realize the meaning of our Christian stewardship. *A Disciple's Response. A Pastoral Letter on Stewardship.*

Now I rejoice in what I am giving up for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in the afflictions of Christ on behalf of his body, which is the church. Colossians 1:24



All of us are stewards – Christ just asks us to examine to what extent are we practicing stewardship? One reason for our practice of stewardship is to help bring about redemption – not just ours, but the rest of the world too.

This stewardship to help bring about redemption, can often be through the use of our time: including setting aside time for prayer, scripture, adoration, worship. But it can also be through our suffering. We'll never understand why we suffer, but our stewardship means that we try to find Christ even in pain, deprivation, and loss. The knowledge that we'll never completely understand it, but that we will strive toward that understanding anyway, reminds us again that Stewardship is also a journey that we must continue to make, even though we'll never get to the end.

Questions:

How does redemption relate to stewardship?

Knowing what we believe and why then prompts us to live out our faith spiritually in the world today. At times, the cost involved in doing this is high. But we are asked to pay that price in trying to incarnate the values of the Gospel and the teachings of the Church today. *Archbishop Thomas Murphy*
