Repentance

In his first words recorded in Mark's gospel, Jesus makes two statements and issues two commands. 'The time of fulfilment' is not ordinary time; it is the moment when God acts decisively to accomplish human salvation. 'The

kingdom of God' is not a place but refers to God's rule and is a manifestation of God's sovereignty as it is about to be revealed in Jesus' deeds of power. Because all this is at hand, Jesus issues two commands: 'Repent and believe.'

What does it mean to 'repent'? The Greek word *metanoeo* (literally, 'to know after') means to change one's mind. A person, after seeing the consequences of action, has a change of mind, plans, or intentions. 'After-sight' brings insight that results in changing one's mind and, consequently, one's action. In this sense even God can repent. For example, in the book of Jonah, after the prophet warns the people of Nineveh that God is about to destroy them for their sin, the king proclaims a fast and


the entire city turns from the evil they have in hand. 'God saw their efforts to renounce their evil behaviour. And God relented: [NRSV = 'changed his mind'] He did not inflict on them the disaster which he had threatened.' (3:10). God relents, that is, God has a change of mind and pursues a different course of action.

In classic religious language 'repentance' is something a sinner does: after seeing the errors of one's ways, the sinner repents. In this sense repentance is a change of mind that leads to a change of conduct (see Luke 3:8) and a concerted effort to live according to what God requires. When Jesus calls people to repent, he calls them to change their minds and conceptions about how it is that God acts and instead to 'believe in the gospel.' To repent here means to see in the gospel - the words and deeds of Jesus - God's definitive saving acts. 'Repent' and 'believe' are two sides of one act - turning one's mind and conforming one's life to the gospel.

for over 300 years has been to evangelize the poor and marginalized all over the world. Worldwide, they have more than 2,500 priests,

brothers, and lay members. The Spiritans were founded by a young French nobleman - Claude Poullart des Places - who gave up the practice of law to study for the priesthood. He founded a community

for young men who wished to become priests and dedicated it to the Holy Spirit. About 150 years later, also in France, Francis Libermann, a converted Jew, started another religious family: the Congregation of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The two congregations, both dedicated to the evangelization and service of the poor, later became one: The Congregation of the Holy Spirit under the protection of the Immaculate Heart of Mary.
