'The hour': cross and glory

In John's gospel Jesus frequently speaks of 'the hour' or 'an hour' that has 'not yet come' (2:4) or 'is coming' (4:21; 5:25), or 'has come' (11:53; 17:1). In this Sunday's gospel, Jesus three times speaks of 'the/this hour' (12:23, 27f). Almost always, 'the hour'

refers to the time of Jesus' death and resurrection or, in John's words, 'his hour to pass from this world to the Father' (13:1).

In this Sunday's gospel Jesus' death is presented in two images: the grain of wheat that falls to the ground and dies and Jesus' being lifted up, which refers literally to being hoisted up and hung on a cross. As grim as this sounds - and certainly Roman crucifixion was particularly gruesome - John sees 'this hour' as a time of glory. This is stated explicitly: 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified' (12:23). But the cross-as-glory is also implied by the expression 'being lifted up.' This is an instance of John's use of double entendre: while 'lifting

up' refers to the crucifixion, it also means 'being exalted.' In John's gospel, crucifixion is exaltation and the cross is Jesus' throne of glory: on the cross his true kingship is revealed (19:19) and his mission is accomplished. For this reason Jesus asserts, 'No one takes (my life) from me, but I lay it down on my own. I have power to lay it down, and power to take it up again' (10:18). Jesus is never more himself than when he ascends the cross as King and exercises power to accomplish salvation. Indeed, John makes the crucifixion a world-wide proclamation of Jesus' kingship: John alone mentions that the charge, 'Jesus the Nazorean, the King of the Jews,' was written in Hebrew (the local and sacred language), Latin (the official language of the Empire), and Greek (the common international language).

Thus, 'the hour' reveals the glory of Jesus and is the climax of his incarnation: 'For this purpose I came to this hour' (12:27). What purpose? 'When I am lifted up will draw everyone to myself' (12:32).
