



The 'disciples' and 'the Twelve'

On Easter Sunday evening, Jesus appears to 'the disciples' who are huddled behind closed doors. The exact location is not indicated ('where the disciples were'); the traditional location, 'the upper

room,' comes from Acts 1:13. After greeting the disciples, Jesus breathes on them, imparting to them both the Holy Spirit and a commission - to forgive sins. In John's gospel this sending of the Spirit (the event normally identified as Pentecost) takes place on Easter Sunday night; indeed, this gospel (John 20:19-23) is traditionally read on Pentecost Sunday, though the revised Lectionary now provides other options for years B and C. The text informs us that Thomas, 'one of the Twelve,' was not present, which sets up the remainder of the story explaining how 'doubting Thomas' becomes a believer. In doing this, the text seems to distinguish between 'the disciples' and 'the Twelve.' This, in turn, raises the question, 'Who was gathered behind those closed doors when Jesus appeared?'

Though John doesn't answer this question directly, the use of two different terms - 'disciples' and 'the Twelve' implies that there are more than 'the Twelve' (actually, the 'Eleven' now that Judas has left the group). This is confirmed in Acts 1:13-15 where Luke lists the names of the Eleven and adds that these were joined by 'some women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers.' At one point 'there was a group of about one hundred and twenty persons in the one place.' The number '120' (12 x 10) may well be symbolic, recalling how the twelve tribes of Israel were divided into units of ten governed by 'wise and experienced' leaders (Deut 1:15; also Exod 18:21; 1 Mac 3:55). The point is that the Holy Spirit is given to all those gathered, not just the Twelve. The mission of all disciples, empowered by the Spirit, is to extend to others the forgiveness Jesus made available through his death-and-resurrection. When the Spirit is thus present, the kind of community described in the first reading becomes possible and the presence of the Risen Christ is made visible.




Enrolment 2024: Sacraments of Confirmation and First Holy Communion
