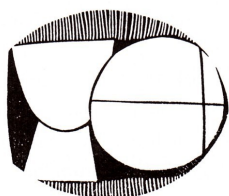

GOOD FRIDAY: STATIONS OF THE CROSS 10.00AM IN THE SCHOOL HALL.

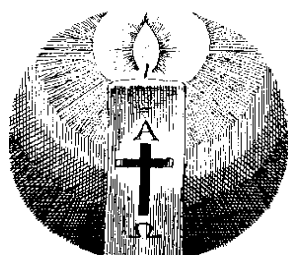

CELEBRATION OF THE LORD'S PASSION 3.00PM IN THE SCHOOL HALL

Good Friday and Holy Saturday are the only days in the Church's year when the Mass is not celebrated. Instead we listen to the reading of the Passion and then venerate the Cross. Holy Communion will be distributed after the veneration.

There will be a collection taken at this service, for the **Holy Places**—they are the holy sites in the Holy Land, which are maintained for people to visit the places where Jesus walked, preached and of course the Holy Places in and around Jerusalem where the events of Holy week and Easter occurred.

Good Friday is a day of Fasting and Abstinence. This means that we are expected to abstain from the eating of meat and to have only one full meal in the day. The elderly and very young are excluded from this expectation.

The greatest Feast of the Church's Year, begins with the lighting of fire and then the Paschal Candle. A series of readings lead us through salvation History to the great events that made us children of God and promised us to rise from the dead.

THE SEASON OF LENT is the most appropriate time for celebrating the **SACRAMENT OF PENANCE**.

Already on Ash Wednesday the people of God has heard the solemn invitation, *Turn away from sin and believe the good news*. It is therefore fitting to have several penitential celebrations during Lent, so that all the faithful may have the opportunity to be reconciled with God and their neighbour and so be able to celebrate the paschal mystery in the Easter Triduum with renewed hearts.

The Sacrament of Penance is better celebrated *before* rather than during the Easter Triduum.

Here in the Parish, each Saturday from 5.00pm—5.30pm the Sacrament of Penance is offered in the Church. We will be using the revised rite of the Sacrament and laminated sheets giving the order of the Sacrament of Penance will be available.

In Holy Week on Tuesday 11th April, there will be a Communal Second Rite of the Sacrament of Penance in the Church at 6.30pm.

This collection promotes the missionary work of the Church in the Holy Land by providing welfare assistance to local Christians in areas such as health, education, employment and housing Parishes, schools, orphanages and medical centres throughout the Holy Land also rely on assistance from the Good Friday collection. The collection is also used to maintain 74 churches and shrines associated with the life of Jesus. Last year, Australian Catholics donated \$1.4 million to this cause, despite tough economic times, rural droughts and increasing cost of living which put a strain on family budgets and financial resources. “As they were marching out, they came upon a man of Cyrene, Simon by name; this man they pressed into service to carry his cross.” MATTHEW 27:32

These opportunities aren’t usually big events, they are usually ordinary occurrences like helping someone carry their groceries or holding the door open for them. The key is putting the other person’s needs before our own and not

Refugees in their own Land—Christians in the Holy Land.

It is a tradition that on Good Friday, a collection is taken for the Holy Places—the holy sites in the Holy Land, which are maintained for the people to visit the places where Jesus walked, preached and of course the holy places in and around Jerusalem where the events of Holy week and Easter occurred.

Much restoration work is being carried out on the holy places and the need for funds is great.

Thinking of the Holy Land it is easy to forget that for some Christians, this is their home land. During my recent pilgrimage, I was fortunate to hear a priest in the town of Taybeh, a unique Christian village on the edge of the Judean wilderness. This living community is linked to Ephraim (Jn 11:54) where it is said that Jesus and his disciples sought refuge after the Council of Priests asked for his execution. The village has been a Christian outpost ever since.

The Parish Priest Fr Johnny, a Palestinian Catholic gave an account of the plight of the Christians in the Holy Land. He stated that 65% of the Christians have left the holy land, mainly because of the lack of employment opportunities and the pressure from the State for them to leave. Benefits are restricted and many are left with not enough to raise their families.

The Catholic Church in Taybeh has set up a number of Employment workshops for the local Christians. A Youth Centre for the young people, a school and other essential parish and community ventures. The last time I visited, I bought a purple Jerusalem stole which was made in one of the workshops by the women of the parish.

Taybeh is off the beaten track and not able to rely on the trade of passing pilgrims. They are supported by donations from groups and organizations from outside the Holy Land. It is hard to imagine what it must be like to be a refugee in your own home land, but that is the reality that the Palestinian Christians are facing. Around Palestinian areas an exclusion Wall has been erected and travel is severely restricted.

During his visit to the Holy Land, Pope Francis said: ‘Build bridges not walls’. The sight of a three meter high wall separating the land to keep people apart, is a terrible indictment of the views of the Jewish State and the threat that they believe is near to them.

One way that we can help, although as a parish we are not rich in resources is on the Masses for Easter to take a Third Collection which will then be sent off through a representative here in Brisbane to the Church in Taybeh, to support them in their very important work.

Please think about their needs, pray for them and give what you can.
