The story of Christmas is the story of God, who in His abounding love and mercy, sent Jesus, the perfect obedient Son to live amongst us. We believe those who listen to Jesus' voice, listen to God's voice. Those who obey Jesus, obey God. Those who obey God become God's children, heirs of the kingdom.

The history of the birth of Jesus is as old as the history of The Fall. As soon as sin enters the world through Adam and Eve, who disobeyed God. God in his loving goodness prepares a plan to rescue men from the power of sin and death. In preparation for the birth of Jesus Christ. God has chosen all key figures for this special rescue mission. These special holy men and women are directly involved in the birth and the life of Jesus. John the Baptist became the Precursor who went ahead to pave the way for the Lord. Mary, an unknown girl from a country town, was specially chosen to be the Mother of Jesus. Her simplicity of life and humble attitude in life has become a universal model for all Christians to exemplify. Joseph, an honest, and upright character, was chosen to take care of the Holy Family. God's messenger, the archangel Gabriel was chosen to execute this holy mission. The messenger travelled forwards and backward like a shuttle to different places, convincing different people for the mission. At first, they were all afraid of taking part in the mission simply because they believe they could hardly do what God expects of them. After much explanation and affirmation that they would not carry the mission alone, God is in the midst of all this. They all listened carefully, though not fully understood, and yet all responded positively to their call seriously, regardless of the sacrifices the call would involve.

For those who have faith in God believe that events such as: the Holy Family's flight to Egypt, and the killing of innocent children were not God's plan but simply attempts on the human part to interfere with God's plan of salvation. They are the dark side of human brutality that is influenced by pure human desires.

Jesus was born in the wilderness because honourable places were reserved for the powerful and wealthy customers; liveable places were for the middle class; the simple poor peasants, the voiceless, like Mary and Joseph were not counted. The only place available was a wilderness where there was minimum essentials and utter discomfort even for the healthy. It was certainly unsuitable for a pregnant woman to give birth. A midwife to assist a childbirth was unavailable and hygiene of the place was nil. We do not dramatize the situation, but we believe, Mary and her son, Jesus survived in such conditions was itself a miracle. God chose the wilderness for the birth of God's Son indicating that God lives amongst God's people but his true homeland is not on this earth; but in heaven. God chose that his Son would be born in a hostile country to highlight the brutality caused by men who refused to obey God. By not obeying God, they followed their own will and that made the world they governed a hostile world, and that inflicted much suffering and pain for their people. The Holy Family became refugees because of the faulty claim of the ownership of the land. It further highlights the way in which God peacefully responded to human ambition - not confronting the hostile situation but quietly running away from it. God chose his Son to proclaim the truth and those who listen to the truth listen to his voice. The truth means Jesus is God's only Son who comes to the world to tell the world about God's love, and to conquer the power of sin and death. God used the weak to humble the strong, non-violence to calm aggression, love to restrain brutality, and death to offer eternal life.

We celebrate Christmas with a thankful heart for the gift of eternal life God has given us. Merry Christmas.
